<i>Callicarpa americana</i> (American beautyberry)	Shrub	Any	Virginia to Texas, West Indies	5-9, 9-1
<i>Gelsemium sempervirens</i> (Carolina jessamine)	Vine	Any	Southeastern U.S., Mexico, Guatemala	7-9, 9-1
<i>Iris missouriensis</i> (western blue flag)	Bulbous perennial	Any	Eastern and central North America	3-9, 9-1
<i>Muhlenbergia rigens</i> (deer grass)	Grass	Any	Southwestern U.S., Mexico	7-11, 11-6
<i>Oenothera speciosa</i> (Mexican evening primrose)	Perennial	Any	Southwestern U.S., Mexico	5-8, 8-1
<i>Sabal minor</i> (dwarf palmetto)	Palm	Any	Southeastern U.S.	7-11, 12-6
