NEW SPEAKER SERIES DEBUTS

WE'RE EXCITED to announce the debut of our new speaker series, Conversations with Great American Gardeners, featuring current and past recipients of our nation-



al awards program. Since 1953, the AHS has been recognizing and celebrating horticultural champions who represent the best in American gardening. We are thrilled to have a dedicated webinar series to highlight these outstanding individu-

als. In a lively and engaging conversation with our host, **Holly Shimizu**, former executive director of the United States Botanic Garden and an AHS board member, these speakers will share their knowledge and experience, gardener to gardener. The host's questions will get to the most inspirational and practical information that everyone wants to know before opening the live conversation up to the viewing audience, granting participants exclusive and convenient access to the speakers.

The first conversation in the series is set for Friday, October 8, with **Karen Washington**, an award-winning longtime community gardener and food justice

activist in New York City who was the recipient of the 2018 Community Greening Award. Washington is also a trustee of the New York Botanical Garden. Then, kicking off the New Year and the AHS's Centennial on January 27, 2022, will be **Michael J. Balick**, a renowned ethnobotanist and recipient of the 2020 H. Marc Cathey award for scientific research, who will discuss his work with traditional cultures in tropical and subtropical environments. Our third speaker, in April, will be **Shane Smith**, a 2012 Professional Award winner who recently retired as the founding director of the Cheyenne Botanic Garden. Smith, who now

lives in Colorado, is a leading authority on greenhouse growing.


