What an exciting year of activities and accomplishments! The biggest news in 2023-24 was the enduring legacy of long-time board member, Marcia Zech. On leaving the board after 13 years of invaluable board leadership, Marcia made a tremendous donation of \$5 million to establish an endowment for AHS. We are thrilled to have Marcia's confidence in our direction and impact and to begin adding to her gift.

January 2024 brought a new logo and brand to AHS for the first time in 25 years. We also updated our Mission, Vision, Values, DEI Statement and Commitment to River Farm, our headquarters in Northern Virginia. We articulated four pillars that guide our work: Health. Beauty. Community. Environmental Sustainability.

During the year, we brought in talented new staff members, including Directors of Development and Engagement, Travel Studies, and National Programs. We hosted 34 Lifelong Learning sessions and launched our first online course, *Gardening in America*. AHS travelers visited the Caribbean, Portugal, Japan and Scotland. We were privileged to host a trip to the Hudson Valley with AHS President's Council members. Our Reciprocal Garden Network grew to almost 400. We could go on and on.




LEADERSHIP GIFTS
