In the Dallas—Fort Worth Metroplex, we'll pair world-class horticultural visits with cultural and historic highlights. Enjoy VIP access and insider tours at the Dallas Arboretum & Botanical Garden, the Fort Worth Botanic Garden, the Native Texas Park at the George W. Bush Presidential Library, and several extraordinary private gardens. As 2026 marks the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence, we'll also reflect on pivotal moments in American history including a visit to Dealey Plaza and the impactful Sixth Floor Museum. In addition, we'll admire the architecture and collection at the world-renowned Kimbell Art Museum. Our home in Dallas will be the five-star Hall Arts Hotel, a striking property in the heart of the city's acclaimed arts district.

We'll then journey by private coach to Austin, where the historic and atmospheric Driskill Hotel will be our base. Special visits in the Austin area will include the acclaimed Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center and the largest wildflower seed farm in the United States. A full-day countryside excursion through the Hill Country will take us past fields of bluebonnet blooms, to the LBJ Ranch, and into the heart of Texas for a classic steakhouse lunch.

I sincerely hope you'll join me in Texas next April for a richly rewarding exploration of gardens, wildflowers, and culture, featuring Southern hospitality and Lone Star charm. Space is limited, so early reservations are recommended.

SUNDAY, APRIL 12

A Lone Star Welcome

Transfer independently from either DFW airport or Dallas Love Field into downtown Dallas for check-in at the beautiful Hall Arts Hotel. After meeting fellow travelers, enjoy an introductory tour of downtown. Visit Dealey Plaza and the fascinating Sixth Floor Museum, which chronicles President Kennedy's assassination and legacy.

Then, on the northern edge of downtown, discover the dynamic landscape of Klyde Warren Park, an 8-acre green space ingeniously built atop an 8-lane highway that once severed downtown from Uptown. We'll learn about the project and the plantings and garden spaces maintained there today.

After some time to settle in back at Hall Arts Hotel, gather for a grand welcome dinner at a fine dining restaurant.

MONDAY, APRIL 13

Dazzling Garden Spaces of Dallas

The morning is devoted to an in-depth exploration of the remarkable Dallas Arboretum and Botanical Garden, where 66 acres burst with color during the peak of spring bloom. Featuring 11 display gardens and a fine collection of rare Texas and southwestern trees and plants, we will be hosted by top arboretum staff and experts for a memorable guided look at the site's many treasures.

Following a delicious lunch with hosts at the Arboretum, the afternoon continues in University Park with a brief guided tour of the 15-acre Texas Native Park at the George W. Bush Presidential Center. Opened in 2013 and named in honor of First Lady Laura Bush, the park was built to LEED Platinum certification standards.

Later in the afternoon, we are fortunate to be invited to visit two remarkable private gardens in the nearby Highland Park neighborhood – special chances to see "behind garden walls" and meet local gardeners. Drinks will be offered at one of the homes. Tonight, gather for a fun, casual dinner together at a popular Uptown eatery.

TUESDAY, APRIL 14

Where the West Begins: Fort Worth and its Gardens

Drive westward to Fort Worth, Dallas' sister city, home to over one million residents. Known as "where the West begins," Fort Worth embraces its cowtown roots - once the start of the Chisholm Trail - and its railroad heritage. The city's laid-back spirit is unmistakable, as are the abundance of belt buckles and cowboy hats. The day begins at the Fort Worth Botanic Garden, the oldest botanical garden in Texas and soon to celebrate its 100th anniversary. A special highlights tour includes the tranquil Japanese Garden and the historic Rose Garden, which will be approaching full bloom.

Later in the morning, enjoy a private, curator-led tour of the renowned Kimbell Art Museum, widely considered one of the world's finest small art museums. We'll discover the collection's top masterpieces, the groundbreaking Louis Kahn architecture, and the surrounding horticultural design, along with the elegant Renzo Piano addition.

After an authentic Tex-Mex lunch at a longtime local favorite, the afternoon features two magical private garden estates. The gracious owners will open their homes and expansive gardens, sharing personal stories and inspirations behind their lush Texas landscapes.

Returning to Dallas in the early evening, dinner is independent tonight.

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 15

The Road to Austin: Home of Weird and Wildflowers

This morning, a 4-hour drive (including comfort stop) carries us south into the "Heart of Texas," with our first Austin-area stop being the wonderful Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center. Opened in the early 1980s, this one-of-a-kind space - envisioned by First Lady Lady Bird Johnson and now operated by the University of Texas - continues to uphold its original mission: inspiring the conservation of native plants. Enjoy a light lunch at the site's café before joining top staff for a private guided tour of the 25 acres of cultivated gardens, arboretum, and research centers.

Driving into Austin proper, we are making plans for a special guided visit in a beautiful garden environment, with more information available in the coming months.

Then check into the grand old dame of central Texas hotels, the Driskill, a superior four-star hotel in the heart of downtown Austin. Tonight, we celebrate our arrival in Austin with a delicious dinner featuring seasonal Texas cuisine.

Bluebonnets, LBJ, and More in the Texas Hill Country

Our final full day takes us out into the Texas countryside, crisscrossing the wild open landscapes of Texas Hill Country, just west of Austin. Our touring will be flexible, in order to take the best possible advantage of ongoing wildflower blooms, including the legendary bluebonnets that occur between Austin and Fredericksburg. Our stops will include the country's largest wildflower seed farm, the LBJ National Historic Park on the site of the former president's ranch, and a delectable country lunch. Along the way, we will stop to marvel at nature's beauty in both landscapes and the colorful swaths of wildflowers that typically dot the Hill Country in mid-April.

This evening, back in Austin, we toast our fellow travelers and the great gardens of Texas during a festive farewell dinner at one of Austin's top restaurants.

Hall Arts Hotel, Dallas (3 nights)

Opened in 2019, the Hall Arts Hotel immediately brought a dynamic, colorful elegance to the Dallas luxury hotel scene. With an excellent location surrounded by museums and performing arts venues on the northern edge of downtown, this five-star property offers an art-filled haven from the bustle of Dallas. The creation of a renowned Napa Valley wine-producing couple, the hotel is a magnet for locals and visitors alike, with its lush lounge spaces and buzzy bars. Rooms are large and well outfitted, and guests can enjoy the large state-of-the-art fitness center or the amazing rooftop sundeck and pool.



The Driskill, Austin (2 nights)

This stately historic building is Austin's oldest hotel, and it works hard to stay among its finest. Near the state capital, the Driskill has been hosting VIP visitors for well over a century, and its grandiose architecture and dazzling public spaces are sure to inspire. Rooms are an elegant crème and tan palette, with design featuring modern clean lines and many antique touches, like brass fixtures, vintage luggage-style tables, and Texas woodwork. The atmospheric bar, with its cowhide barstools and nightly pianists, has been an important Austin scene for as long as anyone can remember, with some of the best drinks in town and several bartenders who have been fixtures at the Driskill for decades.

AHS TRAVEL ACTIVITY LEVEL DESCRIPTION: AHS Travel programs are designed to offer immersive experiences and often involve long days filled with exploration and extensive walking on uneven terrain. To participate in a program, it is recommended to be in good physical condition and prepared to walk for a minimum of two miles each day.

HEALTH: At AHS Travel, ensuring the health and safety of our guests is our top priority.

All participants will be required to follow safety/sanitization protocols set forth by ISDI Travel, local staff, and host country laws. By forwarding the deposit for passage, the passenger certifies that he/she does not have any physical or other condition or disability that would create a hazard for him/herself or other passengers.

DEPOSIT & FINAL PAYMENT: A deposit of \$1,000 per registrant is required to reserve space on the tour, of which \$500 is nonrefundable for ISDI's registration and planning fee unless the tour is cancelled due to low enrollment. This deposit may be paid by check or by Visa, MasterCard, or American Express. Final balance will be invoiced and is due on December 19, 2025, and must be paid by check or wire/ACH transfer to International Seminar Design, Inc. Registrations are accepted after this date on a space-available basis.

TRAVEL INSURANCE: Travel Insurance is not included in the tour cost, but participants are strongly encouraged to purchase a travel protection plan in conjunction with this tour, including coverage of trip cancellation, trip interruption, emergency evacuation/repatriation, medical expenses, lost or damaged baggage, and other expenses and/or losses incurred due to unexpected situations. Should a participant cancel at any time after registering for the tour, ISDI must strictly abide by the cancellation policy outlined herein. Travel insurance information will be provided upon receipt of your registration. One travel insurance provider to consider is USI Affinity Travel Insurance Services. FLIGHTS: Airfare is not included in the tour price. Participants are responsible for their own air arrangements. Please do not purchase airline tickets until the operation of the tour is confirmed by ISDI.

TERMS & CONDITIONS: Upon receipt of registration, ISDI will send registrant a Participant Tour Agreement detailing the full terms and conditions for this tour. This document must be signed and returned to ISDI before participant's registration is considered complete and any arrangements can be confirmed. ISDI will send all documents pertaining to the tour by email unless specifically requested otherwise.

TOUR PRICE INCLUSIONS:

3 nights at Hall Arts Hotel, Dallas; 2 nights at The Driskill, Austin; 5 breakfasts, 4 lunches, 4 dinners, 1 reception; water, soft drinks, coffee, tea included with all meals; 2 glasses of wine or beer included with dinners; ground transportation by private motor coach; entrance fees to sites per itinerary; services of an ISDI Tour Manager; expert local guides; personal listening devices for duration of the tour; handling of 2 pieces of luggage per person at hotels; gratuities for guides, drivers, and restaurant staff at included group meals; bottled water on motor coach; service charges and taxes.

Written cancellation received by ISDI between December 20, 2025 and February 27, 2026: refund of all monies paid minus \$3,500 per person cancellation fee (includes the registration and planning fee). Written cancellation received by ISDI on or after February 28, 2026: no refund. Tour registration is non-transferable. In the case of cancellation, substitutions are not allowed. After the tour has commenced, no refunds will be issued for any reason including, but not limited to, unused portions of tour. If the tour is cancelled by ISDI or the American Horticultural Society due to low enrollment, active registrants will receive a full refund of all tour payments.
