



Itinerary

SUNDAY, MAY 3

Welcome to the Brandywine Valley

Arrive independently to the boutique Brandywine River Hotel, located approximately 35 minutes from Philadelphia International Airport (PHL). This evening, gather with AHS Host Rochelle Greayer and fellow travelers for a welcome dinner at an excellent nearby restaurant.

MONDAY, MAY 4

Longwood and Brandywine Cottage

Begin our exploration of the Brandywine Valley at the spectacular Longwood Gardens, one of the world's great garden treasures. A member of Longwood's horticultural team will lead an engaging tour of 12 dazzling conservatory galleries, each brimming with lush plantings and a brilliant spectrum of color. Then enjoy a special luncheon onsite with a presentation by a senior designer on Longwood's world-class horticulture displays. Following lunch, explore Longwood's classical gardens surrounding the extravagant water fountains and see the seasonal varieties in bloom. This afternoon, acclaimed gardener, author, and lecturer David Culp leads a special visit to Brandywine Cottage, his beloved 2-acre garden, which showcases the design technique of layering—interplanting many different species in the same area so that as one plant passes its peak, another takes over.

TUESDAY, MAY 5

Winterthur and Mt. Cuba

The morning is devoted to Winterthur Museum, Garden & Library, the former residence of horticulturist Henry Francis du Pont. We will explore the magnificent 60-acre garden—both by tram and on foot—celebrated for its naturalistic design and massive displays of color throughout the year. We also have the opportunity to see du Pont's unparalleled collection of American decorative arts, displayed throughout the remarkable 175-room mansion. Following lunch in a nearby historic tavern, continue to Mt. Cuba Center, an outstanding public garden recognized for its commitment to the conservation of native plants and the habitats that sustain them. Take an in-depth look at the gardens and learn about Mt. Cuba's efforts to promote sustainable gardening practices.

WEDNESDAY, MAY 6

Scott Arboretum and Chanticleer

Spend the morning at Scott Arboretum of Swarthmore College. Tour the idyllic 350-acre arboretum that makes up the Swarthmore College campus, often named one of the most beautiful campuses in the country. The Arboretum's robust gardens represent the horticultural diversity of the Delaware Valley region and serve as a living museum for students and local gardeners. Following lunch, continue to the marvelous Chanticleer, often called "a pleasure garden" for its ingenuity and bold plantings. Take a guided stroll through Chanticleer's imaginative themed gardens linked seamlessly by winding paths, including the Teacup Garden, Ruin Garden, Pond Garden, and bulb meadow. Return to the hotel for free time before reconvening for a farewell dinner this evening at a fantastic local restaurant.



THURSDAY, MAY 7


Bartram's Garden and Departures

Check out of the Brandywine River Hotel and depart on a group transfer to Philadelphia International Airport (PHL). En route, stop at Bartram's Garden, the oldest surviving botanic garden in North America and a National Historic Landmark. Stroll through the fragrant flower gardens and learn how botanist John Bartram devoted himself to the collection, cultivation, and study of North American plants, thereby creating the premier collection of North American plant species in the 18th century. Arrive at PHL in the early afternoon for return flights home.

Land Package is per person, based on double occupancy and a minimum of 15 paying participants.

AHS TRAVEL ACTIVITY LEVEL DESCRIPTION: AHS Travel programs are designed to offer immersive experiences and often involve long days filled with exploration and extensive walking on uneven terrain. To participate in a program, it is recommended to be in good physical condition and prepared to walk for a minimum of two miles each day.

HEALTH: At AHS Travel, ensuring the health and safety of our guests is our top priority.

All participants will be required to follow safety/sanitization protocols set forth by ISDI Travel, local staff, and local laws. By forwarding the deposit for passage, the passenger certifies that he/she does not have any physical or other condition or disability that would create a hazard for him/herself or other passengers.

DEPOSIT & FINAL PAYMENT: A deposit of \$1,000 per registrant is required to reserve space on the tour, of which \$500 is nonrefundable for ISDI's registration and planning fee unless the tour is cancelled due to low enrollment. This deposit may be paid by check or by Visa, MasterCard, or American Express. Final balance will be invoiced and is due on January 23, 2026, and must be paid by check or wire/ACH transfer to International Seminar Design, Inc. Registrations are accepted after this date on a space-available basis.

FLIGHTS: Airfare is not included in the tour price. Participants are responsible for their own air arrangements. Please do not purchase airline tickets until the operation of the tour is confirmed by ISDI.

TRAVEL INSURANCE: Travel Insurance is not included in the tour cost, but *participants are strongly encouraged to purchase a travel protection plan* in conjunction with this tour, including coverage of trip cancellation, trip interruption, emergency evacuation/repatriation, medical expenses, lost or damaged baggage, and other expenses and/or losses incurred due to unexpected situations. Should a participant cancel at any time after registering for the tour, ISDI must strictly abide by the cancellation policy outlined herein. Travel insurance information will be provided upon receipt of your registration. One travel insurance provider to consider is USI Affinity Travel Insurance Services. TERMS & CONDITIONS: Upon receipt of registration, ISDI will send registrant a Participant Tour Agreement detailing the full terms and conditions for this tour. This document must be signed and returned to ISDI before participant's registration is considered complete and any arrangements can be confirmed. ISDI will send all documents pertaining to the tour by email unless specifically requested otherwise.

TOUR PRICE INCLUSIONS:

4 nights at Brandywine River Hotel; 4 breakfasts, 3 lunches, 2 dinners; water, soft drinks, coffee, tea included with all meals; 2 glasses of wine or beer included with dinners; ground transportation by private motor coach as outlined in the itinerary, including a transfer to Philadelphia International Airport (PHL) on 5/7/25; entrance fees to sites per itinerary; services of an ISDI Tour Manager; expert local guides; personal listening devices for duration of the tour; gratuities for guides, drivers, and restaurant staff at included group meals; bottled water on motor coach; service charges and taxes.

TOUR PRICE EXCLUSIONS: Airline tickets, airline taxes and surcharges, and baggage fees; airport portage; airport transfer upon arrival; individual airport transfers upon departure for those not using the scheduled group transfer; meals other than those specified in the itinerary; gratuities for hotel housekeeping; personal items such as telephone calls, room service, valet service, à-la-carte orders, specialty wines and liquors, laundry charges, travel extensions, or tour deviations; travel insurance; any other items not specifically included in the itinerary.

CANCELLATIONS & REFUNDS: Cancellation by participant must be made in writing to ISDI and is effective only upon acknowledged receipt by ISDI. There is a nonrefundable registration and planning fee of \$500 per person regardless of cancellation date. Written cancellation received by ISDI on or before January 23, 2026: full refund minus the \$500 per person registration and planning fee. Written cancellation received by ISDI between January 24 and March 19, 2026: refund of all monies paid minus \$2,000 per person cancellation fee (includes the registration and planning fee). Written cancellation received by ISDI on or after March 20, 2026: no refund. Tour registration is non-transferable. In the case of cancellation, substitutions are not allowed. After the tour has commenced, no refunds will be issued for any reason including, but not limited to, unused portions of tour. If the tour is cancelled by ISDI or the American Horticultural Society due to low enrollment, active registrants will receive a full refund of all tour payments.
